52 Groups Oppose Congress Acting on App Trail & BR Parkway Crossings

Fifty-Two organizations, representing thousands of individual members in Virginia, wrote to the Virginia congressional delegation on May 16 urging them to oppose "possible federal legislation that would allow the highly controversial Atlantic Coast Pipeline (ACP) to be built across the Appalachian Trail and Blue Ridge Parkway." The groups' letter noted that "Dominion Energy is pressuring some members of Congress to consider legislation that could make it easier to build the ACP along the developers' preferred route. Such legislation would be inappropriate given the ongoing review of the project by agencies and the courts." Separate letters were sent to Senators Warner and Kaine (click <u>here</u> for a copy) and to the eleven Virginia members of the U.S. House of Representatives. ABRA and many of its member organizations were among the signatories to the letter.

Tech Firms Call on Dominion for More Renewables, Less Gas

Ten major data industry companies, including Microsoft, Apple, and Adobe, have written Dominion Energy imploring the company to base its future electricity generation on renewables and to diminish its planned reliance on natural gas. <u>The companies' May</u> <u>8 letter</u> stated:

Given the significance of our growing and energy-intensive industry in relation to total energy demand in Virginia, companies' data center energy interests should be taken into account in decisions regarding the future of the region's energy infrastructure. In particular:

- Companies providing or using data centers want to power our operations with renewable energy resources like wind and solar;
- Data centers are at the forefront of innovative energy-efficient technologies to reduce the energy burden of our operations.
- Energy storage technologies are here today and should be integrated into grid planning.







• Grid planners should take these points into account before building expensive fossil fuel infrastructure projects.

The tech companies' letter concludes:

Dominion Energy's re-filed proposed 2018 Integrated Resource Plan again fails to fully take into account the energy preferences of the data center industry—by limiting the amount of competitively procured solar energy, neglecting to consider energy storage as a cost-effective and beneficial energy resource, and continuing to plan for the development of additional natural gas infrastructure.

Legislation Introduced to Boost Public Participation in FERC Processes

U.S. Senator Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH) introduced legislation on May 15 to create an Office of Public Participation and Consumer Advocacy at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). The <u>Public Engagement at FERC Act, S. 1477</u>, will assist residential and small commercial energy consumers in participating in FERC proceedings, ensuring the public has a strong role in shaping the nation's energy future. Senators Maggie Hassan (D-NH), Bernie Sanders (I-VT), Elizabeth Warren (D-MA), Ron Wyden (D-OR), Chris Van Hollen (D-MD), Richard Blumenthal (D-CT), Ben Cardin (D-MD) and Mark Warner (D-VA) are co-sponsors. Congresswoman Jan Schakowsky (D-IL) will introduce companion legislation in the House of Representatives.

Sen. Shaheen introduced a similar bill in the last Congress, which was referred to the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, as was S. 1477, but there were no hearings. It remains to be seen whether this new version will have a more positive fate.
