A number of public meetings have been held in Pocahontas County over the past month regarding the Atlantic Coast Pipeline Project which is proposed to traverse through Pocahontas County, West Virginia.

The Pocahontas County Commission has also heard from citizens and special interest groups who have shared concerns and questions about this project. In this regard, the Pocahontas County Commission has respectfully requested that the FERC office consider scheduling a public scoping meeting in Pocahontas County so that information and updates can be shared and allow for questions and answers regarding the many concerns of the citizens.

The Pocahontas County Convention and Visitor Bureau (CVB) also respectfully requests that your office consider scheduling a public scoping meeting in Pocahontas County. Like many citizens, the CVB does have concerns that a pipeline project traversing through the county could jeopardize the intrinsic qualities that our visitors find most appealing and that create the foundation for our tourism product and tourism brand. A scoping meeting would provide an opportunity for everyone to better understand the project and become more knowledgeable on the possible impacts a pipeline project may have on our robust tourism industry.
