Mr. Chris Moore contacted Congressman Goodlatte's Roanoke office. Mr. Moore is concerned about the proposed new route for the Atlantic Coast Pipeline, specifically the portion of the route that will take it through Bath County, Virginia for the first time since the project was announced. The new route is Dominion Power's response to concerns expressed by the United States Forest Service about the possible impact of the project on a salamander.

Mr. Moore said he understands the need for the United States to have wider options for energy sources, including natural gas. However, he is unhappy that the new route is now through an area where even more private property will be impacted. He's especially concerned about the impact on karst topography in the county, the inattention to using existing rights of way, and the fact that the route comes so close to property he owns on the Calfpasture River in Millboro.
